Below are a selection of fetishistic cross-dressers and trans-identifying men who have been convicted of crimes. Under a policy that permitted any detainee to request that any search be carried out by female officers, it would be expected that men such as these would be among those making such requests.

Most of the men listed below have committed serious crimes against women, including violent assault, kidnapping, torture, maiming, rape and murder. A few have committed violent crimes against men. A few have committed less serious crimes, and are included because those crimes are related to their fetishistic cross-dressing or of a type likely to have required intimate searching during investigation (such as drugs or weapons offences).

Where there is evidence of manipulative behaviour or specific animus towards law enforcement or a determination to disrupt the actions of those working within the criminal justice system – for example in sentencing remarks or behaviour upon arrest or in prison – this is mentioned. In some of the cases there is strong reason to suspect that the trans identity was claimed insincerely, including in order to be placed in detention with women and/ or to be searched by women.

The point of this exhibit is not to suggest that trans-identifying or cross-dressing men are especially likely to commit crimes. It is to illustrate that some of the crimes committed by trans-identifying or cross-dressing men are of a type almost never committed by women; and that the policies being challenged will foreseeably result in requests for cross-sex searching from men whose motives include an erotic fetish for presenting and being treated as female, hatred of women, animus towards law-enforcement staff and/or a willingness to cause disruption while interacting with law-enforcement staff by any means possible.

Trans-identifying men

1. Andrew Burns (aka Tiffany Scott/ Obi Wan Kenobi/Mighty Almighty), who died in 2024, aged 32, was one of only around 100 offenders in Scotland regarded as so dangerous he was given an indefinite sentence. His many crimes included violence against female members of the public, nurses and prison officers. In 2016 he started to identify as a woman and demanded that only female prison officers be allowed to search him. Three female prison officers defied orders to give Burns intimate body checks and sought support from their trade union. In 2023 he requested and was approved for transfer to a women's prison. This was halted by the Scottish government after the furore about double rapist Isla Bryson/ Adam Graham.

Burns was a serial prison troublemaker. In 2010 he escaped from detention in hospital and scaled the roof, resisting arrest for eight hours. In 2013 he was convicted of stalking a 13-year-old by sending her letters from prison. In 2015, a prison officer said he had raised "hundreds of complaints".

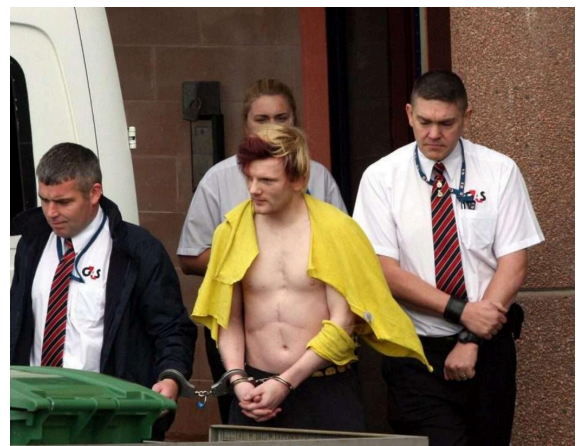

While in a high-security unit he smeared excrement around his cell, bit open his veins to spray people with blood and assaulted four warders and a prison nurse. While being treated in hospital he assaulted a nurse and it took 11 security and prison officers to get him under control.^{1 2 3 4}

2. James Bubb (aka Gwyn Samuels), a Metropolitan Police special constable, was convicted in 2025 of several serious sex crimes, including multiple rapes and abuse of a child over a period of years starting when the victim was 12. At the time of the offences he identified as a man, but during the investigation he changed his name and started identifying as a transgender woman.

Bubb found and groomed his victims on anonymous chat websites and apps, sometimes posing as a 16-year-old girl to do so. The child whose abuse started when she was 12 told investigators that Bubb spoke “a lot about the powers he had” in his role with the Met. The other victim, who met Bubb when she was 18, said that he would “use police training techniques” on her. She told investigators: “The control, the power he got. It sure as hell wasn’t consensual.” The investigating officer described him as a “dangerous, predatory sex offender”.^{5 6}

3. Martin Tarling (aka Abbi Taylor) was convicted in 2025, aged 46, of causing harassment, alarm or distress for retrieving soiled nappies from clinical waste bins, breaking into nurseries, dumping soiled adult nappies and smearing human excrement on walls and on baby bottles. Taylor had a criminal record listing 90 offences, and in November 2014 had been found partially clothed in a bin of nappies. In his Facebook profile he described himself as having an adult baby/diaper lover fetish, which is often motivated by autopaedophilia – a male fetish that consists of being sexually aroused by the thought of being a child.⁷

4. Jamie Wallis (aka Katie Wallis) was convicted in 2025, aged 41, of harassing his ex-wife. Wallis was a Conservative MP from 2019 to 2024 and in 2022 became the first MP to claim a trans identity. In 2021 Wallis had been arrested on suspicion of driving while unfit after his car collided with a lamppost and he fled the scene. He was tried for that offence in 2022 and found guilty of failing to stop and report an accident. The court heard that at the time of the crash he had been wearing a black leather-PVC miniskirt, tights, dark shoes and a pearl necklace. He claimed to have fled because he had PTSD from having been raped and because he was scared of the people who came to help. The judge said he didn't find Wallis "credible".^{8 9}

5. Scarlet Blake (birth name unknown) was convicted in 2024, aged 25, of the murder of Jorge Martin Carreno, to serve a minimum sentence of 24 years. Blake met Carreno one evening, led him to a secluded riverbank, hit him on the back of the head with a vodka bottle, strangled him and pushed him into the river, where he drowned. The judge said the murder was “the culmination of a plan [Blake] had been considering and formulating for months” and that although there was no evidence of sexual activity at the murder scene, there was “ample evidence [Blake] derived sexual gratification from strangulation”.

Prosecutors said Blake had an “extreme interest in death and in harm” and got sexual gratification from violence and killings. Four months earlier Blake had livestreamed himself killing a neighbour’s cat by suspending it with a ribbon and cutting it open. He then dissected and skinned it, and placed its body in a blender, saying: “Well, one day, I want to learn how to do this to a person.”¹⁰¹¹

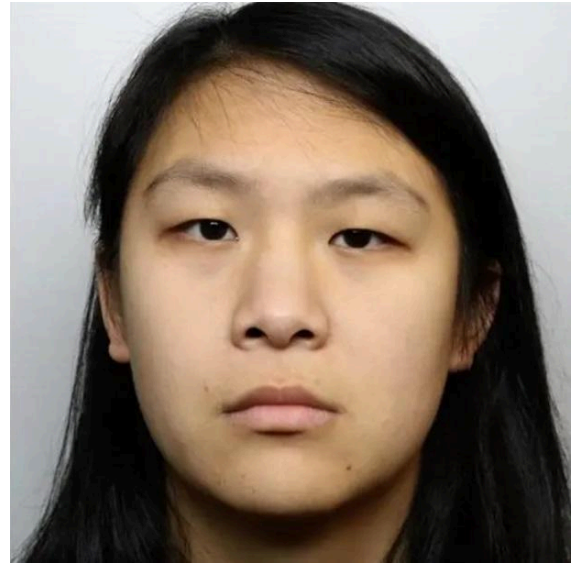

6. Bex McCullgh (birth name unknown) was arrested in 2024, aged 24, after falling for a sting and travelling to meet a person he thought was a young boy. He pleaded guilty to three child sex offences and was sentenced to eight years.¹²

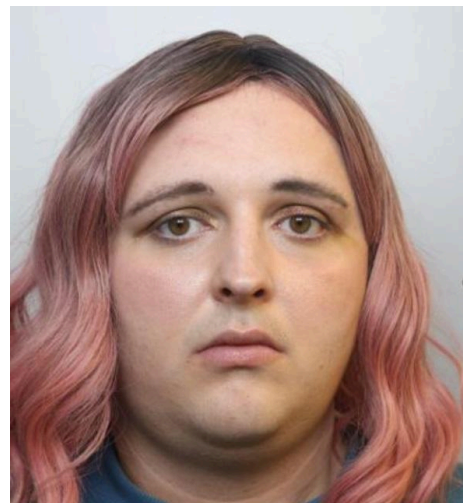

7. Adam Graham (aka Isla Bryson) was jailed in 2023, aged 31, for raping two women in 2016 and 2019. He sought out vulnerable women online and raped them in their homes. He started to identify as a woman after being charged. In court his lawyer claimed he had decided to change gender many years earlier, was taking cross-sex hormones and was on an NHS waiting list for genital surgery. His estranged wife said there had never been any suggestion during their marriage that he identified as a woman and his claim to be a woman was a “big joke” to him. He was initially due to serve his sentence in Cornton Vale women’s prison, but public outcry led to that decision being reversed and he is being held in a men’s prison.¹³

8. Richard Fenton (aka Rachel Fenton) was jailed in 2022, aged 46, for 10 years after using social media to groom multiple children. He got in touch with a fake profile of a 12-year-old set up by a citizen group that monitors paedophile activity online, and tried to encourage the “child” to engage in sexual activity with a six-year-old. It’s unclear when he started identifying as a woman, but was certainly doing so by the time of sentencing. His arrest in 2020 was on suspicion of both arranging a child sexual offence and possession of a class A drug. In some circumstances, an arrest for possession will require a strip search.¹⁴

9. Jason Evans (aka Jason Graham) was sentenced to 19 years in 2021, aged 30, for the rape and murder of 67-year-old Esther Brown. The judge described the attack as involving “the most depraved actions on your part, characterised by utter brutality” and “excessive, sustained violence”. Months before the murder Evans had told social workers that he wanted to change gender. Scottish Conservative justice spokesman Russell Findlay said that case added to concerns about “male sex criminals seeking to exploit the system”.

At the time of the murder Graham was on licence having been released early from a seven and a half year sentence for assaulting and raping a woman. He had 23 previous convictions for home invasions and burglaries targeting vulnerable women in sheltered housing. He had previously been arrested for multiple violent attacks on women involving strangulation, including an assault on a 17-year-old girlfriend in 2010 in which he “pinned her to a bed, strangled her and punched her” and a similar assault on an 18-year-old girlfriend in 2012.^{15 16}

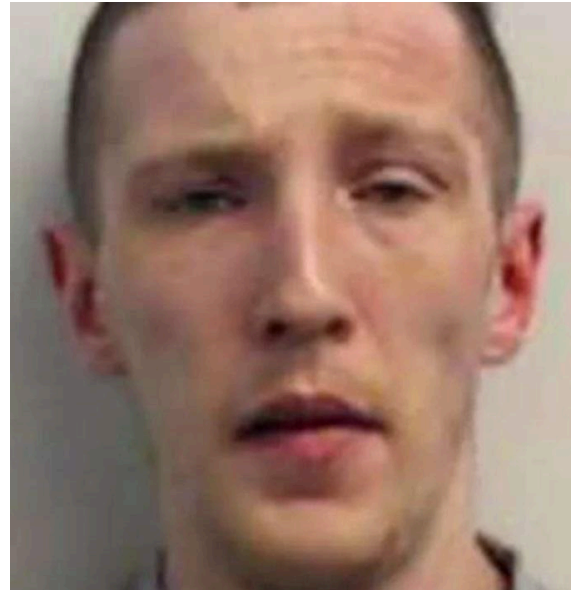

10. Tyrone Sanders (aka Trinity Sanders) has been convicted many times for theft and assault, sometimes racially aggravated, against police officers (both male and female), transport staff, retail workers and security guards. When arrested in 2020, aged 28, on suspicion of burglary he spat at a police officer, urinated and defecated in a police vehicle and committed the crime of indecent behaviour while being held in a police cell.^{17 18 19}

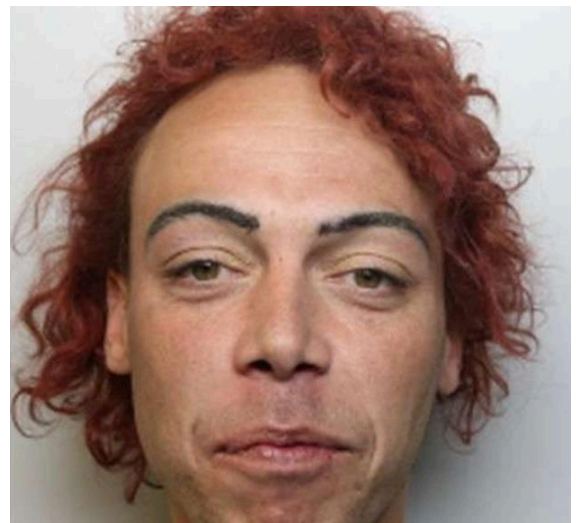

11. Rachelle Mikhnevich has been convicted for a string of violent crimes, including assaults on emergency workers and having a bladed article. In 2020 he assaulted a store manager. After emergency services were called he attempted to bite and spit at two police officers. In 2021 he was convicted after going on a rampage in hospital, biting, kicking and spitting at 7 staff, most of them women. A police officer who arrived at the scene was also attacked.^{20 21}

12. Duncan Smart (aka Jacinta Brooks) was jailed in 2018, aged 41, for 11 years for inciting a child to engage in sexual activity and possessing indecent images. Smart had groomed a 12-year-old girl online by pretending to be a 14-year-old boy, and then asked her to send him indecent pictures of herself. It was his third time in court for child sex offences. He had been released from prison two years earlier, having served almost 13 years for attacking a girl under 16 in 2003.²²

13. Aaron Herschell (aka Alexis Herschell) was convicted in 2017, aged 20, of the attempted rape of a 19-year-old woman he met on a dating app. During custody he identified as a “trans woman”, but no mention was made of this during his trial, suggesting he may have identified as trans while in prison to force female prison staff to search him. While he was remanded in custody in 2016 it was reported he was the first prisoner in Scotland to seek gender reassignment while awaiting trial for sex offences, having never declared trans status previously. Female prison staff raised concerns with management and their union regarding being ordered to carry out rubdown and intimate searches on the prisoner, saying they feared they might lose their job if they refuse.²³

14. Kyle Lockwood (aka Kayleigh-Louise Woods) was jailed for life in 2017, aged 23, for the torture and murder with an accomplice of his 20-year-old girlfriend Bethany Hill. He was sentenced to at least 26 years. Ms Hill was found with her hands bound with tape and multiple stab wounds to her neck. The prosecution presented evidence that her killers had planned the “sadistic” murder for their “perverted pleasure”, practising on a Barbie doll. Lockwood was described during the trial as “a good play-actor and a prolific and practised liar”. Shortly after being sentenced Lockwood was granted a transfer to a female prison. He quickly started a sexual relationship with a female inmate and was returned to a male prison.²⁴

15. Jasmine Hill (birth name unknown) was sentenced to four and a half years in 2017, aged 20, for sexual offences against underage boys. He pretended to be a teenage girl on Facebook to groom his victims to send him explicit sexual images of themselves. While being held in a men's prison on remand before trial he falsely claimed to have been raped by two fellow prisoners. They were arrested, questioned and intimately examined before CCTV footage proved that neither could have raped Hill. The judge told Hill he was "extremely manipulative and will fabricate stories that are simply not true, in order to further your cause."²⁵

16. Richard McCabe (aka Melissa Young) was sentenced to at least 20 years in 2014 for murdering his neighbour, Alan Williamson. The victim sustained 29 stabbing injuries. Despite the violence of the crime McCabe was placed in a women's prison, and because he had murdered a man, not a woman, he remained there after a policy change requiring the transfer of trans-identifying men who had committed violence or sexual crimes against women.

While held on remand in a women's prison before his trial he assaulted a female prison officer, punching her, knocking her over and biting her. Young smoked heroin the day before the murder. Class A drug users are a category of detainees that is more likely than others to require a strip search.²⁶

17. Alan Baker (aka Alexandria Stewart) was jailed for life for murder in 2013, aged 24, after stabbing John Weir 16 times. He is held in a women's prison despite only starting to identify as a woman after his arrest, and despite the violence of the crime for which he was convicted, because that is Scottish government policy, as long as the crime the prisoner was convicted of was against a man not a woman.

While detained together in the female prison estate Baker formed a sexual relationship with another trans-identifying male prisoner, **Daniel Eastwood** (see below, **21**). Since 2019 Baker has been in a relationship with a female inmate, Nyomi Fee, who murdered her two-year-old stepson. In 2023 the couple made allegations of "transphobia" against Jayney Sutherley, a female inmate who referred to Stewart as a man, resulting in her being charged with a hate crime. The court heard that female prisoners had complained about Stewart and Fee "engaging in sexual acts" in a prison shower block and in other public parts of the prison. The verdict was "not proven" but the accusations resulted in Sutherley's parole hearing being delayed by two years.²⁷

18. Peter Laing (aka Paris Green) was jailed in 2013, aged 22, for a minimum of 18 years for the torture and murder of 46-year-old Robert Shankland. Green and two accomplices tied Shankland up, sexually assaulted him with a rolling pin and battered him to death. He started his sentence in Cornton Vale, a women's prison, but was moved because he was pursuing female prisoners sexually and is now held in the women's wing of Edinburgh prison despite the severity of his crimes. He assaulted a female member of prison staff in 2023.

Green has been seeking genital surgery since at least 2018. His victim's sister claimed Green is taking advantage of the system, saying: "The whole thing is a joke. We don't believe he really wants a sex change. He's just trying to manipulate the system and the tax payer is footing the bill."^{28 29}

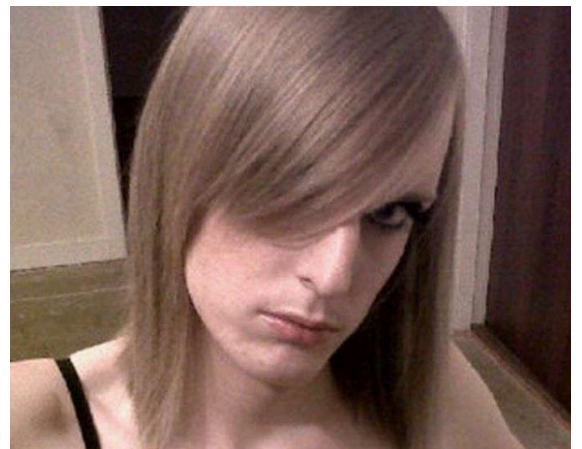

19. Gary Cooper (aka Carrie Cooper) raped a 12-year-old girl in 2011, aged 46, grooming her by pretending online as a 15-year-old girl called Chantelle. He pleaded guilty to these offences and a series of other offences against the 12-year-old and another girl that were revealed during the police investigation. When arrested he was not known to have identified as trans, but by the time of sentencing he had started to call himself Carrie, and both names were used in court records. The judge called Cooper “highly manipulative”. In 2018 Cooper was convicted for separate historic sex offences, and these were treated by the criminal justice system as having been committed by a woman.³⁰

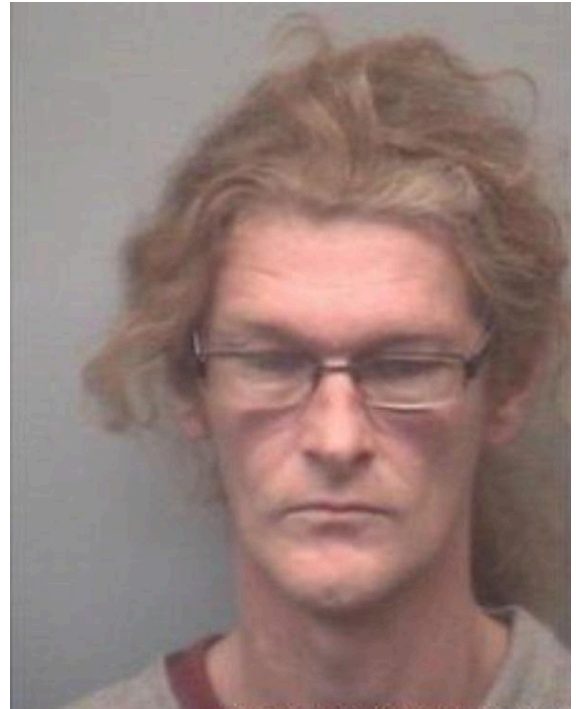

20. Craig Hudson was convicted in 2005, aged 21, of the torture and murder of his wife Rachel. She died after two years of systematic beatings and abuse by Hudson and five members of his family. Hudson was sentenced to life with a minimum of 14 years. The judge said he “displayed a clear tendency to lie”.

While in prison Hudson started to identify as a woman and demanded a wig, women’s clothes and shoes and a prosthetic vulva/ vagina. When these were refused he brought a judicial review, claiming unlawful discrimination on grounds of gender reassignment. The court heard that prison authorities were not convinced his identification as a woman was sincere. The judicial review failed.^{31 32 33}

21. Daniel Eastwood (aka Sophie Eastwood) was convicted of murder in 2004 after strangling a fellow resident in a young offenders' institution with shoelaces. His sentence was increased for an attack on a prison guard. In 2018 Eastwood started to identify as a woman and was moved to the female wing of Greenock prison, where he started a sexual relationship with **Alan Baker** (see above, 17), which resulted in the pair being separated, with Eastwood held among women at a different facility.

Six years later Eastwood was returned to the male prison estate. He has been hospitalised repeatedly for eating razor blades – a pattern of behaviour that increases the need for strip-searching. He is now said to identify as a baby and to have demanded a dummy and nappies, and to have his meals blended like baby food.^{34 35 36 37}

Cross-dressers

22. Philip Tarver was convicted in 2020, aged 47, of the murder of his 86-year-old disabled mother and of threatening to kill his 83-year-old father. He was sentenced to a minimum of 19 years. He was reportedly wearing a negligee when he stabbed his mother in the heart before decapitating her and putting the head in the freezer. He also sliced off his mother's ring finger and put it in the kettle.

In his trial he described himself as a heterosexual man who "quite regularly" wore women's clothes. He claimed that his father was poisoning him after learning that he wanted to change gender.³⁸

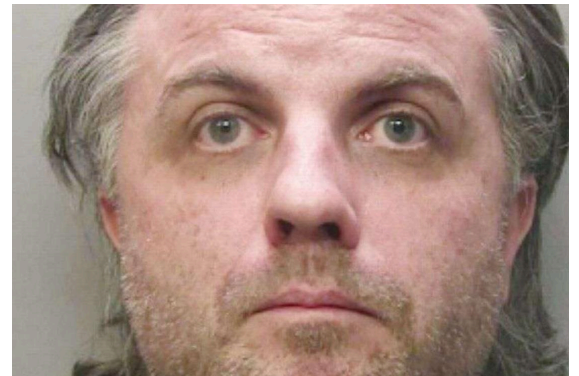

23. Roderick Deakin-White was convicted in 2019, aged 38, of the murder of his fiancée, Amy Parsons. He was sentenced to a minimum of 17 years. He struck Parsons repeatedly with a metal bar when she was in the shower and left her to die in the bathtub. Witnesses testified that Parsons had been planning to leave him because of, among other things, his cross-dressing fetish – he had a Facebook page for his alter ego, Jane. The judge characterised him as “angry, jealous, resentful” and said: “Your view was that if you can’t have her, no-one can have her.”³⁹

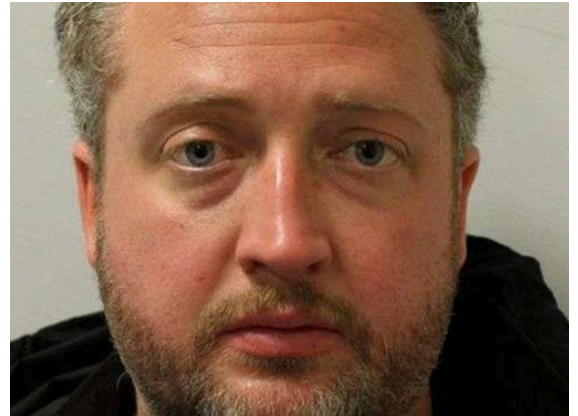

24. David Challenor was sentenced to 22 years in 2018 for holding a ten-year-old girl captive in his attic, which was kitted out as a “torture den”. He sexually abused her, tied her up, whipped her and gave her electric shocks while taking photographs of her abuse. The prosecutor said Challenor had “various sexual fetishes and fantasies” including dressing up as a little girl in onesies and adult-sized baby dresses and nappies. He abused the ten-year-old while pretending to be a little girl called Lucy. He will be on the sex offenders’ register for life.

Between being arrested and convicted, Challenor acted as election agent for his son Ashton, a Green Party candidate and trans-identifying man known as Aimee who lived on and off in the same house as his father but said he hadn’t known about the crime.⁴⁰

25. Graham Cleary-Senior was sentenced to a minimum of 15 years in 2015 for the murder of his wife Frances. Mrs Cleary-Senior survived for a month after being stabbed by her husband, and in a statement to the police described 18 years of violence and abuse by her husband, including frequent beatings and six occasions when he threatened her with a knife. Weeks into their marriage she had discovered that he was a transvestite by coming home early from work to find him in their bedroom in a dress, stockings and high-heeled shoes. On the night of the ultimately fatal attack, after stabbing her he sat down and smoked a cigarette while she called 999. When the police arrived he said: "That fucking bitch wound me up."⁴¹

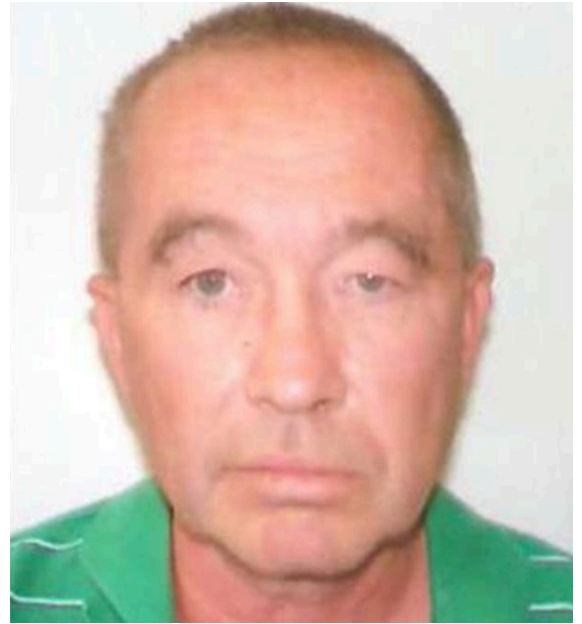

26. Matthew Ashill was convicted in 2010, aged 37, of murdering his wife Clare. He was sentenced to life, to serve a minimum of 15 years. He was reportedly wearing a pink dress when he attacked Clare with dumbbells, a claw hammer and a kitchen knife, inflicting more than 80 injuries including three fatal stab wounds to her heart, and then strangled her. The court heard the couple often argued about Matthew's drug binges and cross-dressing.⁴²

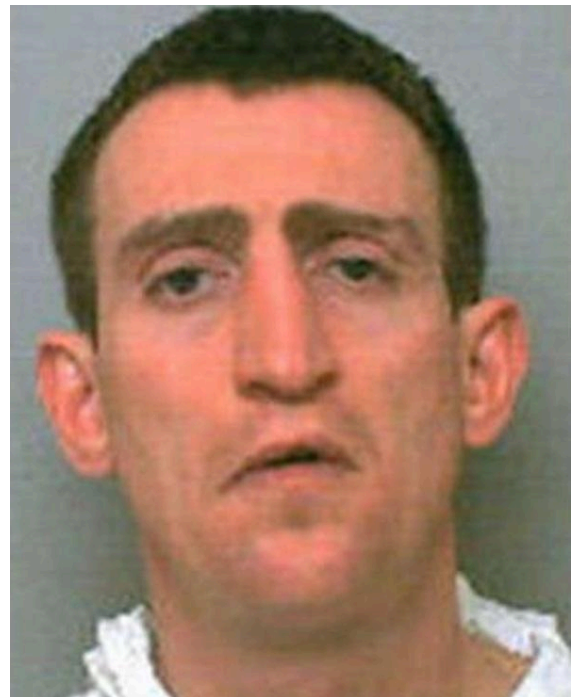

27. Richard Cullen was convicted in 2002, aged 33, of the murder of his 21-year-old neighbour Elizabeth Simms-Rees. They were watching TV together when he attacked her with a mallet and strangled her to death. He raped her corpse multiple times. He claimed falsely that she had been blackmailing him after seeing photos of him cross-dressed; in fact, his family already knew he was a cross-dresser. When convicted he faced rape charges involving two women, but these crimes were never prosecuted because he was already serving a life sentence. He died in prison in 2015.⁴³

28. Michael Chidgey was convicted in 2001, aged 46, for strangling Heather Tell, a 17-year-old dance student, with a shoelace. His DNA was found on Tell's underwear. The court rejected his claim that this was because of his fetish for touching and buying women's underwear, and that Tell must have bought underwear that he had previously fondled in a shop. He told police that he often wore women's clothing and underwear for the purposes of sexual gratification. He had been convicted of multiple sexual offences against women over the previous 30 years, including 10 convictions for indecent exposure, the first aged 16. In 1983 he offered to help a woman whose car had broken down and attempted to rape her before she managed to get away.⁴⁴

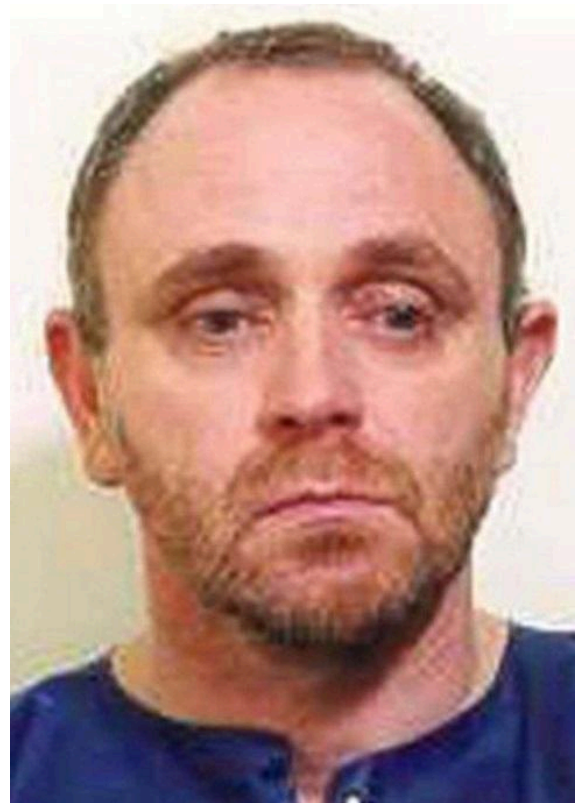
