Dear Ms Moscogiuri, Ms Horton and Mr Ruthven

Re: A Growing Threat – the Anti-Rights Movement in the UK

I am writing in relation to the contents of the above report and inaccurate claims which impact on our good name. As a grassroots organisation focused on **protecting and promoting women's rights** in Wales and beyond, we were appalled to see that we and many similar organisations were, without any foundation, labelled “Anti-Rights”, and the purpose and values underpinning our work were grossly misrepresented.

While the report is no longer on your website, it remains in circulation and the impact of the misinformation about Merched Cymru and other organisations continues. So that we may consider next steps, we would be grateful if you could provide the following information:

- 1 Details of the methodology and criteria used in the research process to establish whether an organisation could be accurately described as “Anti-Rights” and included in the report.
- 2 Details of what attempts were made to contact Merched Cymru to obtain information about the nature and objects of the organisation and its core values.
- 3 Specific details of any evidence Amnesty International UK has that led you to conclude that Merched Cymru meets the threshold for being an “Anti-Rights organisation”.

We would be grateful for a response within 14 days of the date of this letter.
